# Who Qualifies for Benefits Counseling Services?

- At least 14 and under retirement age,
- Receiving SSI, SSDI, or CDB/DAC Benefits,
- And want to work or are:
  - Getting a job, a raise, or an increase in work hours
  - Considering employer benefits (i.e. health insurance, retirement benefits, etc.)
  - Decreasing work hours or ending employment
  - Starting a business


"How many hours can I work without it affecting my benefits?"

# "How much money do I want to have each month?"

Focus on opportunities not limitations

#### SSI: Working Means More Money



## SSI Example

I need \$1,200/month but SSI is only \$733

\$885 from a job plus \$333 SSI is \$1,218

It's more money even though SSI is reduced about \$1 for every \$2 earned (except for the first \$85 or \$65/month)

#### Student Earned Income Exclusion

SSI is <u>not</u> reduced if someone under 22 is a student

- In high school 12+ hours a week
- In college 8+ hours a week
- In a job training course 12+ hours a week (15+ hours if it requires shop practice)

In 2015, eligible up to earnings of \$1,780/month (max \$7,180)

#### Other Work Incentives Can Help

#### Impairment Related Work Expenses (IRWE)

• Expenses paid by the person (not reimbursed or paid by someone else) due to their disability and needed to maintain employment can reduce their countable earned income.

#### Plan to Achieve Self-Support (PASS)

• A special savings program exempt from the \$2,000 asset limit. A person uses job money or other funds to pay for things needed to achieve a specific job goal that will eventually decrease their need for SSI.

#### **MaineCare**

MaineCare continues for most:

With SSI, the MaineCare limit is \$32,784 (2015)

This is called 1619(b)

1619(b) also protects waivers

\$2,000 asset limit still applies
